A VIEW FROM THE BRIDGE In January 2022, Rear Admiral Jude Terry made history when she was the first female in the Royal Navy to be promoted to the rank of Rear



Admiral. She then took the helm as Director of People and Training and Naval Secretary. This makes her responsible not only for more than 40,000 regular and reservist sailors and Royal Marines but also the Royal Fleet Auxiliary - who operate the Navy's crucial support ships – plus civil servants and contractors, all part of the gigantic jigsaw which allows the Royal Navy to operate around the globe 24/7/365. VETERAN'S ORTHOPAEDIC CENTRE The veteran's centre is a part of the Robert Jones and Agnes Hunt Orthopaedic Hospital in Oswestry, Shropshire and is supported by Headley Court. The £6 million two-storey building features nine standard examination and clinic rooms, an enhanced treatment room for minor outpatient procedures, an assessment room, a splinting and therapy room, as well as clinic space for virtual appointments. In the main entrance of the building, there is a café and dedicated Veterans' Hub where Shropshire Council and various military charities will provide support to veteran patients and their family and friends, with issues that range from homelessness, finance, debt management, welfare, post-traumatic stress disorder (PTSD), benefits and more. NUCLEAR TEST MEDAL A few Shorts back, we published the good news that the service of those that had been involved in the UK's nuclear test programme was going to be recognised by a dedicated medal. Whilst the final design is yet to be announced, those eligible for the new medal are now invited to apply, with the intention of distributing the first medals this summer. CORONATION OPPORTUNITY The Department of Culture, Media and Sport

(DCMS) has offered a limited number of free spaces to veterans to witness the royal procession during the coronation of King Charles on May 6th. The seating area is adjacent to the Queen Victoria Statue at the front of Buckingham Palace. Lucky recipients will be need to be seated by 08:30 and the event is due to end at 14:30. The seating is not covered so will be open to rain and the sun and there will be no screens to witness the coronation itself. If you would like to apply for a double ticket, you can do so here.
