THE RNA IN THE COMMUNITY In one of his final acts before standing down after twenty years as Branch Chairman, Shipmate Mick Stevens of the Falmouth Branch, along with other Branch Members, attended the awards evening at T.S Robert Hitchens which is the Falmouth & Penryn Sea Cadet Unit. Mick presented the RNA Cadet Of The Year Cup to Able Cadet Bunclark, who along with the trophy receives a bursary of £365 from Falmouth Branch members enabling her to undertake a week's sea training on either the T.S Royalist or the T.S Jack Petchey. In the great tradition of the RNA being there for its members, they donated £500 towards the purchase of the scooter and the outstanding balance was raised by the Holt Archery Club.
