

FIRESIDE CHATS Tonight's Fireside Chat will be a talk by Commander Tom Sharpe on the near sinking of HMS Endurance (a subject close to my heart as I experienced a near sinking on the previous Endurance!). Tom was CO of HMS Endurance on 16th December 2008 when the ship suffered a catastrophic engine room flood in the Straits of Magellan at the tip of South America and came so very close to having to be abandoned.



Next week's chat (Mon 27th) will be by Michael Edwards who is the manager of the Seafarers Advice and Information Line (SAIL). SAIL is the Citizen's Advice service for mariners and is dedicated to anyone who's ever worked at sea and their partners, widows and widowers.
