

# **COMMONWEALTH WAR GRAVES COMMISSION EYES ON, HANDS ON**

Do you know where the nearest Commonwealth War Grave is to you, do you know who is buried there? There are over 160,000 war graves spread across the United Kingdom in around 12,500 different cemeteries. Some of these cemeteries are large concentrated sites such as Brookwood and others may only contain one grave. With a limited number of maintenance staff and a huge number of graves, the Commission has a project called 'Eyes on, Hands On' where volunteers around the country visit local graves and memorials and carry our very basic maintenance and report damage back to the authorities.
