FIRESIDE CHATS Tonight's Fireside Chat will be a talk by Stuart Wright who is the CEO of the White Ensign Association whose mission is to inform and provide guidance to all serving and former members of the Royal Navy, Royal Marines, Royal Fleet Auxiliary, their reserves and their families on employment, finance, resettlement and personal administration. Stuart is a retired Commodore with 35 years naval service under his pusser's belt.

THE LISBON MARU There can be few stories from the second world war more disturbing than the sinking of the SS Lisbon Maru, a Japanese merchantman carrying



over 1,800 POWs, that was torpedoed by a US submarine on October 1^{st} 1942 in the South China Sea with the loss of over 820 British servicemen, 144 of which were Royal Navy. On February 19^{th} , the Chinese Embassy in the UK hosted a reunion event in Gloucester for survivors and families of those lost. Chinese fishermen in the area were instrumental in the rescue

FOOD INSECURITY SURVEY Northumbria University is working with the RN, RM, Army and RAF Associations to carry out research on food insecurity and financial hardship within the UK Ex-Armed Forces Community. Food insecurity is the lack of enough affordable food of decent quality for your own needs. There is currently very little research on the risk of financial hardship, food insecurity and service attributable injury within the UK veteran population, therefore the research team is inviting veterans and their families to participate in an online survey.
