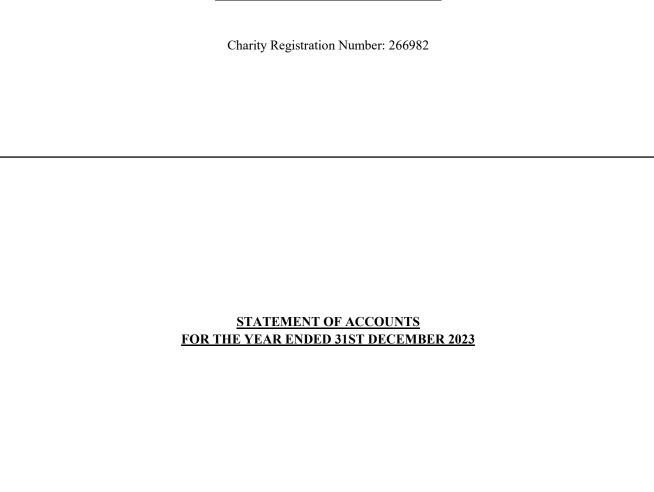

As the charity's trustees, you are responsible for the preparation of the accounts in accordance with the requirements of the Charities Act 2011 ('the Act').

I report in respect of my examination of the charity's accounts carried out under section 145 of the Act and in carrying out my examination I have followed all the applicable Directions given by the Charity Commission under section 145(5)(b) of the Act.

Independent examiner's statement

The Charity's gross income exceeded £250,000 and I am qualified to undertake the examination by being a qualified member of the Association of Chartered Accountants.

1. Accounting Policies

a. Accounting Convention

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention, modified for the revaluation of investments. They have been prepared in accordance with the Statement of Recommended Practice – Accounting and Reporting by Charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK (FRS 102) issued in October 2019, applicable accounting standards and the Charities Act 2011. They have been prepared on an accruals basis of accounting, except fo the restricted funds, which have been prepared on a cash accounting basis.

b. Income Recognition

Income is recognized in the period when the Association is entitled to receipt and the amount can be measured with reasonable accuracy. In accordance with this policy:

Legacies are included when the Royal Naval Association is advised that a payment will be made and the amount involved can be quantified.

Grants are included when the conditions for receipt have been complied with.

Gifts in kind and tangible income are included at cost to the donor if known, or the value to the Royal Naval Association at the date of receipt.

The accounting policy for subscription income is detailed below.

c. Fund Accounting

General funds are unrestricted funds which are available for the use at the discretion of the trustees in furtherance of the Designated funds are comprised of unrestricted funds that have been set aside by the trustees for particular purposes. The aim Restricted funds are funds which are to be used in accordance with specific restrictions imposed by donors or which have Investment income and gains are allocated to the appropriate fund.

d. Donations

Donations are taken as income upon receipt, and allocated to each relevant fund as advised.

e. Life Members' Subscriptions

Life subscriptions cannot be purchased by individuals, but only by Branches and Areas in recognition of meritorious service. Life subscriptions received were brought into the Accounts as income by equal instalments over a period of ten years. But from 2023 Life subscriptions received are now brought into the Accounts as income upon receipt.

f. Gift Aided Subscriptions

Income Tax is recoverable from HM Revenue & Customs in respect of subscriptions paid by gift aid, and is taken into account in the year the subscriptions are received.

1. Accounting Policies (continued)

g. Investments and Bank Deposits

Investments are stated at market value as at the balance sheet date using the closing quoted market price. Realised gains and losses on investments are calculated as the difference between sales proceeds and their opening carrying value or their purchase value if acquired subsequent to the first day of the finacial year. Unrealised gains and losses are calculated as the difference between the fair value at the year end and their carrying value. Realised and unrealised gains and losses are combined in the Statement of Financial Activities. Dividends and interest receivable are included in the income and expenditure account when they are received at an amount which includes any tax credit recoverable from HM Revenue & Customs. Interest receivable from fixed term deposits are accrued in the period that it is due.

h. Expenditure Recognition

Liabilities are recognised as expenditure as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to that expenditure, it is probable that settlement will be required and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably.

All expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis. All expenses including support costs and governance costs are allocated or apportioned to the applicable expenditure headings.

i. Allocation of Support and Governance Costs

Support costs have been allocated between governance costs and other support costs. Governance costs comprise all costs involving the public accountability of the charity and its compliance with regulation and good practice.

The only apportionment to governance costs relate to administrative salaries etc., and annual conference, which are apportioned on the basis of 10% to governance costs, based on staff time allocated to governance issues.

j. Cost of Raising Funds

The costs of generating funds includes investment management costs.

k. Cost of Charitable Activities

The cost of charitable activities includes grants made, costs attributable to charitable activities, governance costs and other support costs.

1. Income Tax Reclaimed on Gift Aid

Income tax is recovered from HMRC on income received from subscriptions and donations by way of the gift aid scheme during the year. However, the actual amount recoverable for the year is brought in as a provision due to the delay in the processing of the information. The difference between the actual amount received and the provision is then adjusted for in the subsequent year.

m. Area Capitation Fees

The area capitation fees are based on two elements, a) 5% of the subscriptions received from branches in each area by 31st December, and b) 80% of the amount over £10,000 recovered from HMRC by way of the Gift Aid scheme.

n. Tangible Fixed Assets

Tangible fixed assets are capitalised when the cost of such assets (excluding VAT) exceeds £500. Tangible fixed assets are stated at cost less depreciation which is provided in annual instalments over the estimated useful economic lives of the assets. Depreciation is provided at the following annual rates:

Fixtures and Fittings 20% straight line

o. Intangible Fixed Assets

Identified website development expenditure is capitalised to the extent that technical, commercial and financial feasibility can be demonstrated. Intangible assets are ammortised on a straight line bases over their useful lives.

p. Stocks

Stocks consist of purchased goods for resale and are stated at the lower of cost and net realisable value. Provision is made for slow-moving or obsolete items where appropriate.

During the year, expenses were reimbursed to the Board of Trustee members which principally represent reimbursed travelling, accommodation and subsistence expenses in attending meetings and official arrangements, which are included in the "travelling and liaison - national council and other committee meetings" cost of £14,938.

16. Funds

- a. The General Fund and Life Subscription Funds are unrestricted funds used for general purposes, and this year the life subscriptions fund has been transferred to the general fund.
- b. The Standards Fund is to be used for the repair or replacement of damaged, lost or stolen branch standards.
- c. The Property Fund is designated for the purpose of acquiring property for use by the Central Office.
- d. The Central Charities Fund is used for specific charitable projects which must provide assistance to serving and ex-naval personnel and their dependants.
- e. The 1000 Good Deeds Fund is to encourage more able shipmates to take less able shipmates out to events.
- f. The Branch and Club Support Fund provides assistance to branches and their clubs.
- g. The Naval Service Memorial Fund (formally known as Charter Challenge 2014 Fund) is used for the future maintenance and insurance of the memorial erected at The National Memorial Arboretum.
- h. The Project Semaphore Fund is to provide information technology to the digitally isolated veterans.
- i. The Helping Hands Fund is to provide assistance to the financing of iPad volunteer expenses. This fund has now been transferred to the general fund.
- j. The Comms Fund is generously provided by Greenwich Hospital as a grant to allow the improved comms within the RNA through employment of a comms professional in the central office team.
- k. The Irish Transport Fund is to provide financial assistance for the provision of transport in the whole of Ireland.
- l. The Minibus Fund is to be used to supply and maintain three minibuses to mitigate social isolation in veterans.
- m. The Podcast Fund is to promote and contribute to the well being of shipmates and tackle loneliness. This fund has now been transferred to the general fund.
- n. The Wellbeing Fund is to provide funds for a salary and delivery for the professionalisation of welfare support to the membership.
- Sparko TV Fund is generously provided by RNRMC for RNA members expenses associated with the supply of the Sparko Project.
- p. TEMS Fund (Transition Employment Mentoring Scheme) is a mentoring scheme for personnel leaving the Royal Navy.
- q. RNRMC SIG Co-ordinator Fund has been established with a generous grant from the afghan fund which has been received from the Covenat Trust through RNRMC. It is aimed at making the Association more accessible and more attractive to working age veterans thereby improving their wellbing and mental health resilience.
