The official opening of Admiral Jellicoe House is now scheduled for the afternoon of **Thursday 20th October**. The event will be by invitation only due to limited space in a running care home. We have secured the Minister of State for Veterans' Affairs to be our Guest of Honour. New residents for the Home are joining steadily, and we will be opening the middle floor for residents later this month.

Cost of Living Crisis - The Grant Team are reacting swiftly to increased demand from those of our people in need. 14. 🛧 Tri -Service Research – Military Families 'Finances

CEO of the Naval Families Federation Sarah Clewes has asked if we could share details of the Tri Service Research into Military Families' Finances below.

This project is being led by the <u>Army Families Federation</u>, supported by the <u>Forces In Mind Trust</u>. The research is being undertaken by <u>RAND Europe</u> and the programme has been reviewed and approved by the <u>MoD Research Ethics Committee</u> – the reference number is 2107/MODREC/21. This project has been endorsed by the MoD and the sponsor is Peter Davis, Head of the MoD Armed Forces Families & Safeguarding Team (AFFS)

The purpose of the research is to explore whether Service families are less financially resilient, or not, when compared to civilians. The Research Team will consider what unique elements of service life might affect families' resilience. For example, they will gather evidence about whether families are affected by:

- The lack of a second salary due to issues with spousal employment, as a result of frequent Service postings
- A non-serving spouse being unable to build up a career, even if they are employed, resulting in less income than civilians would access
- A lack of a spousal pension
- Service accommodation costs being taken at source (housing, CILOCT, water etc) which might impact upon budgeting skills
- The impact of the unpredictable Service lifestyle

The Research Team are currently running a <u>survey</u> which is open to serving personnel, veterans and their families. Key stakeholders who lead the RN career management, welfare and personnel support agencies, will be interviewed to capture their professional perspective. The Research Team has confirmed that they will be able to analyse the completed surveys by Service, and report their findings to us, so that we will be able to identify if there are any RN/RMspecific issues arising that we would collectively wish to be aware of.

Once the survey has closed and the one-to-one stakeholder interviews completed, the Research Team will then host a workshop to discuss their findings and determine what recommendations should be made to the MOD, if any are required. The final Research Report is due to be published in March/April 2023.

15. ★ Marine Jim Wren – HMS Repulse visit National Museum of the Royal Navy

80 years after the devastating attack on HMS Repulse, one of only two remaining survivors from the attack has visited the National Museum of the Royal Navy to see a key artefact from the ship, and recall his experience of the Second World War.

Royal Marine James (Jim) Wren, now aged 102, luckily survived this devastating attack, which is a key point of commemoration to this day. It saw the sinking of two Royal Navy ships, HMS Repulse and HMS Prince of Wales, and the loss of 840 men.

This attack by Japanese bombers on the 10th December 1941 was a disastrous blow to the British war effort. What inspired Jim and his family to visit was the National Museum of the Royal Navy's commemoration of this event. In the Hear My Story (HMS) Gallery the museum had previously held a pair of bells, one from each ship, on display for a special 80th anniversary exhibition.



Jim was more than happy to share his experience of the sinking and the rest of the war, which was regrettably spent in appalling conditions in a Japanese prisoner of war camp.

On his time onboard Jim said:

"After final training at Stonehouse barracks in Plymouth I was assigned to HMS Repulse... She was a wonderful ship, with a wonderful captain, he was a real gentleman."

That captain was Captain Bill Tennant, who managed to survive the sinking of Repulse. Onboard HMS Repulse Jim was involved in the North Atlantic convoy, as well as the hunt for the Bismarck.

Will Heppa, curator at the National Museum of the Royal Navy said:

"It was a great privilege to welcome Marine Jim Wren to the National Museum of the Royal Navy in Portsmouth. The 102-year-old veteran is one of the last two survivors of the HMS Repulse sinking. On 10 December 1941, Jim was on board Repulse when it was repeatedly torpedoed and bombed by the Japanese Air Force off the east coast of Malaysia. The loss of Repulse and Prince of Wales left Singapore weakened and reduced British naval effectiveness in the Far East. As well as seeing one of the bells excavated from Repulse which we hold in the stores, Jim enjoyed showing his family HMS Victory and the dockyard where he worked for several years after the war. He also spoke lucidly and candidly about his experiences of the sinking and his internment in Sumatra after the fall of Singapore in February 1942. It was a particularly sobering experience to meet Jim and hear his stories and it is one which I will find difficult to forget." Jim's powerful story has also evidently caught the attention of the Prince of Wales, who had a portrait of Jim commissioned.

For information, The National Museum of the Royal Navy (NMRN), established in 2009, tells the story of the four fighting forces of the British Royal Navy, the Royal Marines, the Fleet Air Arm, the Submarine Service and the Surface Fleet.

Ours is the epic story of the Royal Navy, its impact on Britain and the world from its origins in 625 A.D. to the present day.

The museum group has museums nationwide and includes the National Museum of the Royal Navy, Portsmouth Historic Dockyard which includes HMS Victory, HMS M.33, and HMS Warrior and the Royal Navy Submarine Museum with HMS Alliance and Explosion Museum of Naval Firepower, both in Gosport, Hampshire; the Fleet Air Arm Museum, Yeovilton; the Royal Marines Museum (currently closed), HMS Caroline, Belfast, which will reopen soon and NMRN Hartlepool (including HMS Trincomalee).

Good morning everybody,

My late Aunt Edna served in the Wrens as a radar operator from 16th September 1942- 31st December 1945 when she was released to shore.. Edna was very open about the fact that she was based at Selsey Bill Radar and also claimed she lived in the late Patrick Moore's house on Selsey Bill.

I have managed to obtain copies of Edna's service documents and they confirm that she was in the Wrens and served at the following establishments:- HMS Pembroke iii which was at Mill Hill in North London, HMS Victory iii, which was either Leydene House, or Wooley Park, Wantage, and HMS Ringtail. The latter was a Fleet Air Arm airfield in Lancashire.

Now the good news. Included with the documents was a copy of the information extracted from the Payment and Victual Ledgers. The ledger showed she did serve at Selsey Bill Radar and was accommodated in HMS Victory iii. Unfortunately, the trail has now gone cold and here is the reason why I am asking for your help. Googling Selsey BIII Radar and after examining an Ordinance Survey map have drawn blanks. Does anybody know the location of Selsey BIII Radar? Finally, was there a Radar Station in Formby Lancashire?

I will thank you for any help you can give.

We had our own display marquee adjacent to Pusser's Rum tent (perfect!), and were joined this year by Mike Tarrant of MT Miniatures who put on a display of 1/700 scale RN model kits that visitors to the Model Makers marquee were able to purchase. Personally, I couldn't resist the temptation and spent far more

than the 'long haired Admiral' would have been happy about!

On Sunday 31 July 1949 HMS Amethyst completed her epic escape down the Yangtse river, re-joining the fleet with the famous signal "Have rejoined the fleet south of Woosung. No damage. No casualties. God save the King".

Sunday 31 July 2022 saw the 73rd anniversary (to the date and the day) of the event and Reigate Branch held their 4th commemoration of the escape and the life of her Captain, Commander John Kerans, DSO, Royal Navy at a ceremony at





St. Peter's Church, Tandridge, where he is buried.

Members of the Branch, Reigate Sea Cadets, families and representatives from the Amethyst Association, the Mayor of Reigate & Banstead and the Royal British Legion gathered at Cdr Kerans' graveside where prayers for the fallen and for reconciliation were followed by the last post, a minutes silence, the exhortation and reveille. The Branch standard was paraded and wreaths were laid on behalf of the Branch and the Amethyst Association.

Commander Kerans' daughters, Charmian and Melanie, his grand-daughter Leonie and great grand-daughters Eliza and Stephanie were present, together with Gilly O'Reilly, daughter of Lt. Commander K. Stewart Hett, MBE, RN (Ret.) who was an officer on board Amethyst during her escape and who served for many years as President of the Amethyst Association.

The commemoration of HMS Amethyst's escape is now firmly established as part of Reigate Branch's annual calendar of events.



After the commemoration the company accepted the kind invitation of Oxted Branch of the Royal

British Legion and retired to their comfortable bar where many health's were drunk and toasts



proclaimed.

The bomb exploded before hitting the water and for his bravery the then Lt Lucas was awarded the first naval VC for his prompt action which saved the ship and company.

In commemoration the church holds a small service at the graveside of Admiral Charles Lucas which this year was attended by standard bearers from Paddock Wood, Maidstone, Ashford and Chatham along with members from



these branches. Maidstone sea cadets were also present and paid their respects.

The party as a whole was treated to some excellent hospitality by MKW in its premises on the banks of the River Lahn in the

1st	1870	First successful RN firing of Whitehead torpedo.
2nd	1945	Merchant ship losses from 3 September1939 to 2 September 1945: 4,786 vessels of 21,194,000 grt.
3rd	1939	War declared against Germany. Winston Churchill appointed First Lord of the Admiralty for the second time. 'I sent word to the Admiralty that I would take charge forthwith and arrive at 6 o'clock. On this the Board were kind enough to signal to the Fleet "Winston is back". So it was that I came again to the room I had quitted in pain and sorrow almost exactly a quarter of a century before, when Lord Fisher's resignation had led to my removal from my post as First Lord.
4th	1995	RN Detention Quarters (RNDQs) at Portsmouth closed and all personnel in detention transferred to the Military Corrective Training Centre (MCTC), Colchester.
5th	1979	Funeral of Admiral of the Fleet the Earl Mountbatten of Burma in Westminster Abbey. Interred later that day in Romsey Abbey.
6th	1993	HM The Queen approved the eligibility of all ranks of the armed forces for appointment to the Distinguished Service Order.
7th	1959	Keel of frigate Nubian laid by Mrs Unwin, wife of Rear-Admiral J.H. Unwin, Admiral Superintendent of Portsmouth Dockyard. She was paid 5s which represented the piece rate for the job.
8th	1983	Minehunter Waveney launched, fourth of name and first of class.
9th	1754	William Bligh, future Captain of HM Armed Transport Bounty, Director (64 guns) at the Battle of Camperdown and Glatton (56 guns) at Copenhagen, Vice-Admiral of the Blue, born at Plymouth.
10th	1862	Britain's first timber-hulled ironclad, Royal Oak, launched at Chatham. She carried 25,000 sq ft of canvas, and her reciprocating engines, powered by 20-psi steam, drove a 19ft-diameter hoisting propeller.
11th	1919	Hermes, first ship to be designed, ordered, and built as an aircraft carrier, launched at Armstrongs on the Tyne. Completed at Devonport. Sunk by Japanese naval aircraft off Ceylon 9 April 1942.
12th	1920	The Nab Tower, a 9,000 ton concrete and steel structure designed as a permanent link in the anti-submarine barrage in the Dover Strait but incomplete when the war ended, was towed from Shoreham by two naval tugs and sunk off Portsmouth as a replacement for the Nab lightvessel. The structure settled with a 1.5 degrees list to the S.W. A workforce of 3,000 men

		had been secretly drafted-in for the construction project which cost \pounds 1,250,000.	
13th	1985	Orpheus made last submarine visit to Manchester. There was a firm liaison with Exide, which made submarine batteries.	
14th	1918	HMS Argus commissioned: first flush-deck carrier.	
15th	1995	HMS Thunderer, RN Engineering College, Manadon, paid off. Training transferred to Southampton University.	
16th	1940	First German parachute mines dropped on London. Seventeen out of at least twenty five failed to explode or were fused to delay detonation.	
17th	1965	The Admiralty Board have approved in principle a recommendation by the Committee on Television in HM Ships that suitable ships (frigates and above) should be fitted with the basic installation to enable recreational television sets to be used on board. DCI(RN) 1397/65.	
18th	2009	The National Museum of the Royal Navy formally launched at Portsmouth Naval Base.	
19th	1914	Royal Marines landed at Dunkirk.	
20th	1941	Gibraltar harbour attacked by Italian submarine Scire with chariots.	
21st	1867	The first 'time and percussion fuse' introduced.	
22nd	1914	The RNAS mounted the first British air raid on Germany. Four aircraft left Antwerp, flying over the Rhine and Ruhr, to bomb the airship sheds at Cologne and Dusseldorf. Three turned back because of fog but Fl/Lt C.H. Collet– a captain RMA – pressed on and dropped three bombs at Dusseldorf: one missed and two failed to explode. DSO. (Collet was the first RNAS officer to loop-the-loop.)	
23rd	1977	Frigate Complex at Devonport Dockyard, originally known as Leander Frigate Complex, developed over No. 2 Basin and enclosing Nos 5, 6 and 7 Docks, opened by Dr David Owen. Galatea docked as demonstration of facility.

25th	1953	First Type 14 frigate HMS Dundas launched by J. Samuel White at Cowes. First of the Blackwood-class to be completed was HMS Hardy by Yarrows, Scotstoun, on 15 December 1955	
26th	1776	Horatio Nelson appointed acting lieutenant in HMS Worcester.	
27th	1941	The Navigation School housed since 1 January 1906 in the Old Naval Academy, Portsmouth Dockyard, and seriously damaged in an air raid on10 March 1941, completed a move to the requisitioned Southwick House over Portsdown Hill and was commissioned as HMS Dryad.	
28th	1969	First RM deployment to Northern Ireland, 41 Cdo RM on Spearhead duties.	
29th	1758	Horatio Nelson born.
