

106. **Standard Bearers and Escorts** should be dressed in accordance with the dignity of their office as follows;

Blazer / Shirt

The Blazer should be Black or Navy Blue with RNA badge, full, life or associate as appropriate. Uniform may be worn by members of the Naval Service or Naval Cadet Organisation.

Jacket may be double or single breasted with RNA Buttons. A plain White shirt is to be worn under the Blazer



Trousers



Trouser should be dark grey or Charcoal grey .

They should just touch the top of the shoes. It is advisable to wear a belt or braces which will allow the trousers to hang correctly.

Ladies have the option to wear grey trousers or grey skirt.

Shoes

Black boots or shoes are to be worn. They should be black with or without toecaps, highly polished and in good repair. **Patent shoes are not allowed.** Socks should be black or dark grey and plain.



Beret



Service Beret in black or navy blue with the Royal Naval Association Standard Bearers Beret Badge over the left eyebrow.

The headband of the beret is to be level all round, one inch above the eyebrows, The top of the beret being pulled over to the right.

Ladies have the option to box their berets with the Association beret badge shown front centre

Tie

The Tie should be the official RNA tie and worn so that the badge is showing as in the picture opposite.

The Badge on the tie should be as close as possible in line with the lapel Badges.



RNA Lapel, Standard Bearer and Veterans Badges



The RNA lapel badge should be worn on the left lapel.

A Veterans badge may be worn alongside and inboard of the Association lapel badge.

A Standard Bearers badge may be worn, if desired in the right lapel. A total of 6 bars may be added to the standard bearer's lapel badge. To be hung in one line only.

Gauntlets

Gauntlets will be white and in good repair with no adornments.



Medals



Full sized medals are to be worn on the left side.

The top of the ribbon is to be 4 inches from the shoulder seam of the jacket. The medal ribbon is to be one and three quarter inches in length.


A single medal should be worn midway between the arm seam and lapel of the jacket as shown in the picture.

Multiple Medals are sighted 4" below the shoulder level.

Only officially awarded medals are to be worn



Slings



The sling will be of brown polished leather and worn over the left shoulder and under the left lapel. All brasswork on the sling will be polished,

The 'Bucket' of the Sling will have a brass cup inserted and is to be polished.



Foul Weather Jackets

Standard Bearers are allowed to wear the official foul weather/inclement jackets during inclement weather. NO decorations or medals are to be worn with this clothing.
